

Penetanguishene Curling Club

The Penetanguishene Curling Club / Team Howard Community Centre has been woven into the fabric of our town for more than a century, reflecting both Penetanguishene's strong French Canadian roots and its deep commitment to community life. First registered with the Ontario Curling Association in 1903, the Club built on years of informal curling already taking place in the area. Its early competitive success helped put Penetanguishene on the provincial and national curling map, including an Ontario Junior Tankard win in 1928 and a remarkable legacy of 10 Ontario, 2 Canadian, and 2 world championships.

When the original curling facility was lost in the late 1950s, local curlers rallied. Through determination, volunteer labour, and personal financial guarantees, members partnered with the Town to build a new home that would serve not just curlers, but the entire community. Completed in 1973, the facility stands as a testament to grassroots leadership and shared vision.

Today, the Club operates as a not-for-profit organization and manages the building year-round as a true community hub. From sport and social events to weddings, fundraisers, and charitable gatherings, the Penetanguishene Curling Club has left a lasting mark - strengthening community bonds, fostering volunteerism, and creating a welcoming space that generations continue to call their own.


